NEW COVID UPDATE

We have made the following changes within our Parish. Please note that our upmost priority is to keep you safe so some restrictions will remain.

1. Stewards will continue to welcome you at weekend Masses to assist with hand gel, track and trace and sanitising. We will ensure there is good ventilation in the church.
2. There will no longer be stewards at weekday Mass-es. With this in mind please ensure you add your name to the attendance list, use the hand gel provided and sanitise your seat.
3. We strongly recommend you continue to use the hand gel we provide for you. Similarly we strongly recommend the continued use of face coverings, at least until local Covid figures begin to decline. They are rising steeply at the moment.
4. There will no longer be a need to book yourself into a Mass. We will continue to use the track and trace lists so please ensure you are ticked off on the list when you arrive or add your name and contact details.
5. You will notice that the colour coding of benches has been removed. We ask you to use common sense when social distancing.
6. We will continue to use the side aisles for Holy Communion and return to your seat down the central aisle for the final prayer and blessing.
7. Singing will be allowed as long as a mask is worn. Hymn books will be available and will be sanitized each week, to be used the following week.
8. There will be no change to the Holy Water stoups and they will remain out of use for the time being.
9. Servers will be invited to return but only on a rota system. Retraining will be provided. Those wishing to serve or serve again should contact Caroline in the Office or Deacon Tim.
10. Collections will continue under the current system.
11. There will be no offertory procession of bread and wine for the time being.
12. There will be no change to the sign of peace.
13. Holy communion will continue in the current way apart from the timing ie distribution will be before the final prayer and Blessing. If you wish to receive Holy Communion on your tongue you must wait until the end of the Communion queue.
14. There will be no procession down the central aisle on exit from St Joseph's but there will be a procession at St Gregory's. The Priests will greet parishioners in the hall for Coffee after Mass at St Joseph's.
15. Social events will resume with appropriate risk assessments in place.
16. Home visits will resume. Precautions will be taken to ensure the safety of parishioners and ourselves. If you require a home visit please contact Caroline in the Parish Office.

If you are a Eucharistic Minister please contact Caroline in the Office, before making any visits, who will provide some important updates regarding health and safety and Covid regulations.
